The Annual Warren Wetzel, MD Trauma/Emergency Medicine Symposium represents the only regional conference dedicated solely to the management of trauma patients. As such, it has been able to attract a nationally recognized faculty. New York City has 18 trauma centers, and the Symposium provides an important forum for the sharing of science and ideas related to trauma.

Program Goals

Physicians and nurses should be aware of the many complex management strategies available for the treatment of the injured, in order to minimize complications and mortality. The educational goals of the Symposium are for the attendees to:

- Explore the science and most current management of pelvic fractures based on institutional influences.
- Examine some of the pitfalls when managing pain in the emergency department.
- Review the events of the Boston Marathon Bombing and what lessons apply to New York City.
- Discuss selective imaging for trauma patients on arrival to the emergency department.
- Learn about a new aspect of acute care surgery, “surgical rescue.”
- Survey the various alternatives to opioid analgesia in the trauma patient.
- Hear the challenges and perspective of a real-life trauma survivor.
